

Yesterday (Wednesday) I led worship at Village on the Isle. Our celebration of Christ the King, like our worship on Sunday, closed out the church year. Now we look ahead. On Tuesday, Faithful Elves descended on the church and transformed our worship space in hopeful expectation of the Advent and Christmas seasons.

In Mark 13.37 Jesus instructs those who follow him, "...what I say to you, I say to all: Keep Awake."
